This application may be sworn to before any officer having and using a seal. It must be filed in the local land office of the district in which the land is located. It must not be forwarded by applicant to the Commissioner of the General Land Office or to the Secretary of the Interior.

The following is quoted from a letter from the Secretary of the Interior to the Commissioner of the General Land Office under date of July 15, 1912:

"The Secretary of the Interior is authorized, upon a satisfactory showing therefor, to reduce the required area of cultivation In the administration of this provision it is not believed that the physical or financial disabilities or misfortunes of the entryman should be the grounds of reduction, but the sole question should be as to whether, under the peculiar conditions governing the tract entered, the exaction of cultivation of this particular tract by any entryman to the amount required is reasonable. The exact, special, physical, and climatic conditions of the land entered in each case must, therefore, determine whether the required amount of cultivation should be reduced. * * * * As a general regulation governing applications for reduction in area of cultivation, it is directed that all entrymen who desire a reduction shall file applications therefor during the first year of the entry and upon forms to be prepared and furnished by the Commissioner of the General Land Office and distributed through the land offices. Where a satisfactory showing is filed in support of an application for reduction, you will submit the same with your recommendation in the premises. Otherwise the application will be by you rejected, subject to the usual right of appeal. The final granting of any reduction in area of cultivation rests with the Secretary of the Interior, who may, in appropriate cases, defer action until final proof.

"A mere breaking of the soil will not meet the terms of the statute, but such breaking or stirring of the soil must also be accompanied by planting or the sowing of seed and tillage for a crop other than native grasses."

March 8, 1912, Lacy E. Shaffer made homestead entry 015005, your series, for the St NW2, St NEt Sec. 35, T. 4 N., R. 19 W., S. B. M., upon which final three-year proof was submitted January 23, 1917, and final certificate withheld pending field investigation. There are no withdrawals.

October 19, 1916, the claiment filed in your office an application for the reduction of the required area of cultivation, stating that very little of the land can be cultivated because same is flooded each year, and the soil carried away or the crops destroyed.

On April 13, 1917, a special agent of this office

reported that he made examination of the entry March 1. 1917, and found the greater part of it to be in the river bottom, covered with gravel, boulders and locse shifting sand, and practically worthless for any purpose; that the high waters during each year have gradually taken away parts of the cultivable land, leaving only gravel and sand and destroying the value of the land for agricultural purposes; that the river hed is constantly being filled up, the channel changing from year to year. and that it would be futile for entrymen to try to cultivate any of the land; that the improvements consist of a frame house 20 x 24 feet, frame barn, well, clicken house, about one mile of barbed wire fence, and between 6 and 8 acres under cultivation; that residence was established in the summer of 1912, and was continuous antil the submission of final proof. The agent recommends that the application be ellowed and the area of cultivation reduced to 6 acres.

In view of the feregoing, the application is hereby allowed and the area of cultivation reduced to 6 acres.

On March 8, 1912, Lacy E.Shaffer, of Fillmore, Cal., made H.E. 015005, Los Angeles series, for the SiNWi, & SiNEi, Sec. 35, T. 4 N., R. 19 W., S.B.M. Final proof was offered on January 23, 1917, but certificate was withheld.

Application for reduction of the required area of cultivation was filed in the local office on Oct. 19, 1916, which application was referred to this office for investigation and report.

In pursuance of instructions from Chief of Field Division, Mr.George Hayworth, investigation of the case was made on March 1, 1917, and the following report thereon is respectfully submitted:

The above-described land is located on the Santa Calra River, about 3 miles east of Fillmore, Cal. The greater part of it is in the river bottom, is covered with gravel, boulders and loose shifting sand and is

practically worthless. Along the south bank there is a narrow strip of soil and a fringe of willows. When the entry was made there were about 40 acres of fair cultivable land along the banks of the river, but a flood during the winter of 1913-14, which washed away several hundred acres of alfalfa and orchard lands in that vicinity, carried away practically all of the cultivable land on this tract, leaving only between 8 and 10 acres that could possibly be cultivated. The high waters during each succeeding year have also gradually taken away parts of the cultivable land, leaving only gravel and sand devoid of humus, and therefore worthless for farming purposes. In the summer seasons willows grow up in various places in the river bottom and during the high water periods these catch the debris, boulders and silt and cause the water to spread out and flow in various channels. The result is that the river bed is constantly being filled up, the channel is rapidly changed from year to year, and the cultivable lands in the valley are gradually being washed away and destroyed.

The improvements upon the claim consist of a good three-room frame house, about 20 x 24 ft. in size, frame barn, well, chicken house, about a mile of barbed wire

ed that Shaffer and his family established their residence on the land in the summer of 1912 and continued to reside there until after proof was made. The only absences were for a few days at a time. They are now living upon adjoining and higher land where there is not so much danger from floods. Cultivation was started during the second year of the entry, 1913, when about 8 acres were cultivated to corn, potatoes and barley. This area was increased to about 12 acres in 1914. Part of this cultivated land was destroyed by floods, and during the past two years crops of oats and barley hay have been raised on practically all that remains of the cultivable land.
