Valley College Grid Coach to Resume Post

VAN NUYS — Valley College line coach Duane Putnam, temporarily back in professional football ranks, will return to his regular duties with Valley's Monarch eleven Monday, Aug. 28.

Putnam, an all-pro guard during his 12-year tenure with the National Football League that included 10 years with the Rams and a year each with the Cleveland Browns and Dallas Cowboys, is working with the newly formed New Orleans Saints.

Putnam reported to the Saints' training camp at California Western University in San Diego and has been coaching the expansion team's offensive guards and centers.

Valley College head football coach George Goff said the call for Putnam to assist the NFL team illustrates the caliber of coaching football players at Valley College are receiving and will continue to receive.

Master of ceremonies will be Steve Bailey, radio station director.

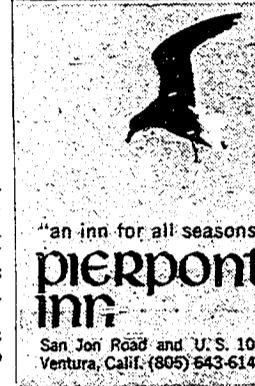
Circus to Be Benefit for Scholarships
